

Report about 7 September Conference in Rabwah

On Wednesday, 7 September 2016, the opponents of the Jama'at all over Pakistan held conferences, rallies and conventions to mark the September 1974 decision against the Jama'at. In order to mark the occasion, a conference was held at the Qari Shabbir Usmani's madrassa at Muslim Colony, Rabwah as well. The conference began at 3 pm after which some children and adults recited Na'ats. Around 100 participants attended this session, which continued until 5 pm. The following clerics made speeches during this session:

- 1- Maulwi Muhammad Yusuf Farooqi of Lahore
- 2- Maulwi Mumtaz Ahmad Awan of Lahore
- 3- Qari Shoaib Ahmad Khan of Mianwali
- 4- Farid Ahmad Paracha (Deputy Amir Jama'at Islami Pakistan)

All these speakers praised the decision of the Pakistan parliament against the Ahmadis and used uncivilized language about the Ahmadiyya Jama'at.

The second session began at 9 pm after the participants had offered the Isha Prayer. This session ended at 3:30 am. The session was chaired by Shabbir Ahmad Usmani, the director of the madrassa at the Muslim Colony, Rabwah. Around 200 – 250 people attended the session. The clerics who made speeches during this session are as follows:

All the above-mentioned speakers targeted the Ahmadiyya Jama'at in their speeches and instigated the participants of the conference against the Ahmadis. The speakers said that they invited the Ahmadis to embrace Islam, that the Qadianis were a tree planted by the British, that the Qadianis were undermining

the very foundations of Pakistan, that the Qadianis should be removed from key posts in the country, that the people who were accepting Islam from among the Qadianis in Chenab Nagar (Rabwah) were being harassed by the Qadianis, that if the local police did not take action against such Qadianis, the clerics would take the matter into their own hands, that September 7th was an historical day, since on that day the conspiracy hatched by the Qadianis was exposed, that now the Qadianis are conspiring against the resolution passed by the National Assembly of Pakistan against them, and that the conspiracy would be frustrated by the [Muslims]. The speakers also said: Our youth took bullets on their chests and got the resolution approved against the Ahmadis, so we will make every sacrifice to safeguard the resolution. The Qadiani sect was established by the British; hence they are agents of the British. The Qadianis are illegally building worship places in Chenab Nagar [Rabwah]. The government should take immediate action against them.

The conference ended on 2:45 am. Towards the end of the conference, the following resolutions were presented before the participants of the conference:

Resolutions

- This conference condemns the terrorist attacks in Quetta and Mardan and demands that the government and military establishment should take firm action against the terrorists.
- This conference demands solid action against those who speak against our beloved country and condemns all such international powers and the neighboring countries that are involved in efforts to undermine and sabotage the CPEC [China Pakistan Economic Corridor]. We demand that stringent measures be taken against all such elements that are destabilizing Pakistan for the sake of anti-Pakistan forces.
- This conference pays tribute to all those valiant soldiers of Pakistan Army who, since the 1965 war to this day, have laid down their lives for the safety and security of this country. Also, the conference pays tribute to the statement in which General Rahil Sharif has very bravely told the anti-Pakistan elements to refrain from their activities against Pakistan.
- The conference expresses concern over the increasing anti-Islam activities of the Qadianis across the country. The conference considers the response of the government to such activities to be very inadequate and, therefore, demands that in order to fulfill the requirements of the

Islamic clauses in the Pakistan constitution, a check should be placed on the activities of the Qadianis making them act upon the constitution of Pakistan and barring them from playing with the ideology of Pakistan and thus hurting the sentiments of its people.

- The Qadianis are engaged in hatching conspiracies against Islam and Pakistan. They are trying to secretly increase their influence in the government institutions and thus seeking the fulfillment of their dreams against Pakistan. To defend the geographical and ideological boundaries of Pakistan, it is necessary to ban all Qadiani activity in the country and remove them from all key posts.
- The aggression of the Qadianis is on the rise in Chenab Nagar. Their terrorists who are equipped with modern weapons patrol the town in vans. Their uniforms resemble the Elite Force uniforms. They intimidate the innocent Muslims going their own way and subject them to violence. While the police and administration exists, the Qadianis have no right to engage in such activities.
- The NIC should have the religion column in it, or the NIC belonging to the Muslims should be of a different color, so that the legal and constitutional requirements in this regard are fulfilled.
- The Qadiani printing press in Chenab Nagar should be sealed and taken into custody. The Qadiani TV channel (MTA) is constantly spreading hate and disorder and defames the beliefs and ideology of the Muslims. The government of Pakistan should ban the transmission of the channel in the country and cancel the declarations for the Qadiani newspapers and periodicals.
- The punishment for apostasy should be implemented as per recommendations of the Council of Islamic Ideology.
- Green belts and roads in Chenab Nagar should be transferred to the TMA and the land occupied by the Qadianis should be taken into custody by the government.
- To deceive the innocent Muslims, the Qadianis have scribed the Quranic verses on their places of worship. This is a clear breach and rejection of the Anti-Ahmadiyya Ordinance. The members of this conference, therefore, demand that such inscriptions on the Qadiani places of worship be removed.
- The conference demands the inclusion of essays on Khatm-e-Nubuwwat in the text books, so that the new generation of the Muslims can be made

aware of their obligation towards the safeguarding of Khatm-e-Nubuwwat and the protection of the honor of the Holy Prophet, peace be upon him.

- The government controls the administration of the institutions of all other sects but not the ones belonging to the Qadianis. The participants of this conference, therefore, demand that like other non-Muslim institutions, the government should also take the administration of Qadiani institutions in its own hands.
- By portraying themselves as Muslims, the Qadianis are ruthlessly using Islamic terminology and symbols. The participants of this conference demand that the government should make sure that the Anti-Ahmadiyya Ordinance is effectively acted upon and the Qadianis are not allowed to use the title 'Islam' for themselves.
- Pakistan was established in the name of Islam and thousands of Muslims had laid down their lives for this purpose. It is therefore necessary to implement the Sharia in the country doing away with the interest based economy.
- The conference expresses concern over the situation resulting from terrorism, murders, kidnappings, robberies, and the missing persons in the country. We demand that the government should make sure that the political parties, instead of protecting their own fame, should safeguard the life, wealth and honor of the ordinary people.
- In order to protect the Islamic and ideological identity of the country, chapters highlighting the importance and excellence of the Khatm-e-Nubuwwat creed should be included in the syllabus taught at the schools. Instead of secularizing the text books, the syllabus should be based on Islamic teachings, thus implementing the Sharia in Pakistan.
