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Mentioning about Hazrat Muawwiz bin Haris (ra), Hazrat Khalifatul Masih (aa) stated:

He belonged to the Khazraj tribe of Medina. He was among those who were present in Bai'at Aqba in Mecca. He participated in the battle of Badr with two of his brothers and was martyred in this battle. Hazrat Muwiz (ra), alongside his brother Hazrat Muaaz, played a crucial role in the killing of Abu Jahal in this battle.

Regarding the killing of Abu Jahal, Hazrat Musleh Maud (ra) explains that sometimes we take pride in things, but in reality, they end up causing our destruction. During the battle of Badr, the Meccans were sure that they will not return without utterly destroying Muslims. However, from among the people of Medina, whom the Meccans looked down upon, two boys ended up killing their leader, Abu Jahal. As such, the victory that Abu Jahal wanted to celebrate turned into a great tragedy for him.

Next, Hazrat Khalifatul Masih (aa) narrated about another Badri companion, Hazrat Ubayy bin Ka'b (ra). He belonged to the Khazraj tribe of Medina. He was part of Bai'at Aqba in Mecca with 70 other people. He knew how to read and write even before accepting Islam. As such, after accepting Islam, he had the honor of being one of the scribes of revelation of the Holy Prophet (sa). He was alongside the Holy Prophet (sa) in all battles.

He was an expert in the knowledge of Quran. The Holy Prophet (sa) once said that the greatest reciter of my Ummah is Hazrat Ubayy (ra). He was among the four persons about whom the Holy Prophet (sa) had said that if you wish to learn Quran, learn it from one of them.

Hazrat Musleh Maud (ra) once explained that among the companions of the Holy Prophet (sa), there were four people who had learned the entire Quran from the Holy Prophet (sa) himself and it was their task to teach Quran to others. These four teachers are as follows: Hazrat Abdullah ibn Masood, Hazrat Abu Huzaifa, Hazrat Muaz bin Jabal, Hazrat Ubayy bin Ka'b.

It is mentioned in a narration that the Holy Prophet (sa) once said to Hazrat Ubayy (ra) that Allah has commanded me to recite Quran to you. Hazrat Ubayy (ra) asked whether he was named by God. The Holy Prophet (sa) replied in affirmative. Hazrat Ubayy (ra) asked again whether he was mentioned by the Lord of the worlds. The Holy Prophet (sa) replied yes. Upon hearing this, Hazrat Ubayy (ra) wept. It is recorded in history that as per the command of God, in his last year, the Holy Prophet (sa) recited the entire Quran to Hazrat Ubayy (ra).

It was narrated from Anas bin Malik (ra) that the Messenger of Allah (sa) once said: "The most merciful of my Ummah is Abu Bakr; the one who adheres most sternly to the religion of Allah is 'Umar; the most sincere of them in shyness and modesty is 'Uthman; the best judge is 'Ali bin Abu Talib; the best in reciting the Book of Allah is Ubayy bin Ka'b; the most knowledgeable of what is lawful and unlawful is Mu'adh bin Jabal; and the most knowledgeable of the rules and obligations is Zaid bin Thabit. And every nation has a trustworthy guardian, and the trustworthy guardian of this Ummah is Abu 'Ubaidah bin Jarrah." Hazrat Ubayy (ra) used to freely ask questions from the Holy Prophet (sa). The Holy Prophet (sa) also paid special attention towards the education and training of Hazrat Ubayy (ra). Once, during the recitation in Fajr prayer, the Holy Prophet (sa) forgot to recite one verse. After the prayer, the Holy Prophet (sa) inquired from the companions whether he forgot to recite a verse. The companions stayed silent. The Holy Prophet (sa) asked whether Hazrat Ubayy (ra) was present. Hazrat Ubayy (ra) pointed out the verse and asked whether it had been abrogated

or the Holy Prophet (sa) had forgotten to recite it. The Holy Prophet (sa) replied that I forgot to recite it and I knew that no one would have noticed its omission except you.

Once, Hazrat Umar (ra) saw that in the nights of the month of Ramadan, some people were individually praying in the mosque while others were praying in small congregations. Hazrat Umar (ra) stated that I think it would be better to gather them behind one person and then asked them all to pray behind Hazrat Ubayy (ra).

Hazrat Umar (ra) established the system of Shura in his era. Hazrat Ubayy (ra) was a member of this Shura. Many companions of the Holy Prophet (sa) used to learn the ahadith of the Holy Prophet (sa) from Hazrat Ubayy (ra). Hazrat Khalifatul Masih (aa) mentioned various incidents of Hazrat Ubayy (ra) portraying his deep knowledge of the Quran and Ahadith. The committee that was established by Hazrat Usman (ra) for the compilation of Quran also worked under the guidance of Hazrat Ubayy (ra).
